

Flipping Your Classroom

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What does it mean to 'flip your classroom'?

- The Flipped Classroom is a form of blended learning in which students learn content online by watching video lectures, usually at home, and 'homework' is done in class with teachers and students discussing and solving questions.
- Moving 'lectures' outside of the classroom allows teachers to spend more 1:1 time with each student.
- Students have the opportunity to ask questions and work through problems with the guidance of their teachers and support of their peers-creating a collaborative learning environment.



A Comparison

Traditional Classroom

- Instructions happen in class
- Students apply their knowledge and understanding at home
- Students ask questions when they come back to class

•The classroom teacher's role is to provide information.

Flipped Classroom

- Instructions happen outside of class
- Students apply their knowledge and understanding in class (enhanced discussion)

•The classroom teacher's role is to facilitate students' learning and guide them.

What if my students do not have access to the Internet?

- If your school is a 1:1 school students can download the videos while they are at school.
- Students often have access to the internet at local libraries, cafes, restaurant (many fast food outlets offer free Wi-Fi) where students can connect their mobile devices to download the videos directly from the school server.

Can I use videos created by other teachers?

- If the video has everything that your students need to know then use it (ensure that it is copyright free) otherwise YOU know your students best (once you make it and save it you have it forever)

I don't have time to create the videos in my own time

- Your videos do not have to be fancy with special features and introduction.
- Record it as you would teach- how you would explain something in class
- Remember, they do not have to be box office number 1 hits!!



Advantages of the Flipped Classroom!

Students can learn at their own pace.

Parental involvement/understanding.

It frees up class time for more hands on work.

Enhance experience for advanced learners.

You can share how you deliver materials to the class, with your colleagues.
